Welcome to a new era for typography and for our culture at large.





Never use extroverted pointiness or bevels if you want citizens to appreciate your typographic jewels; be unequivocal in your use of softness. {DINSchrift}

Bubbles and loops are nonviolent mechanisms for theorizing ideas which were unimaginable just twenty years ago. {Helvetica Rounded}

Positive expert use of roundness quickly elicits mostly happy reactions and will render some justification bearable in magazines. {Cooper Black}
